

Maximum Resale Price of Electricity in Guernsey

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MAXIMUM RESALE PRICE OF ELECTRICITY IN GUERNSEY

Background

The purpose of setting a maximum resale price for electricity is to protect customers who do not purchase electricity directly from a licensed electricity supplier but from a third party. A typical example would be where a landlord pays for the electricity used by their tenants and separately charges the tenant for electricity, often via the landlord's meter.

Historically, the States Electricity Board had the ability to set the maximum resale price of electricity under The Electricity Law 1933.¹ On 1st February 2002, this power transferred under Section 23 of The Electricity (Guernsey) Law, 2001 and empowers the Guernsey Competition and Regulatory Authority (GCRA) to set the maximum price at which electricity may be resold on the Island of Guernsey.²

In line with the overall increase in electricity prices set out in the Statutory Notice of Final Decision document of the Cost Pass-through for Guernsey Electricity Limited 2019,³ the maximum resale price now needs to be revised consistent with that to the extent equipment settings allow.

Maximum Charges in accordance with section 23 of the Electricity (Guernsey) Law, 2001

The Guernsey Competition Regulatory Authority, in accordance with the powers granted under section 23(2) of the Electricity (Guernsey) Law, 2001, hereby fixes the maximum price at which electricity to which section 23 applies may be resold at 19.23 pence per kilowatt hour, from 1 July 2019.

The GCRA also hereby directs Guernsey Electricity Limited in accordance with section 23(2)(b) of the Electricity (Guernsey) Law 2001 to publish this maximum resale price in a manner that will secure adequate publicity for it, including but not limited to publication on the Guernsey Electricity Limited website.

If any person resells electricity to which section 23 of The Electricity (Guernsey) Law, 2001 applies, at a price exceeding the maximum price of 19.23 pence per kilowatt hour, the excess shall be recoverable by the person to whom the electricity was resold as a civil debt in accordance with section 23(4) of that Law.
