Dear John

Wave Telecom ("Wave") welcomes the Office of Utility Regulation's ("OUR") finding that Cable & Wireless Guernsey ("C&WG") breached Licence Condition 32 by refusing to meet a request to provide On-Island 45 Mbit/s Leased Line Tail Circuit, and thereby restricted Wave's ability to compete in the provision of Telecommunications Services in the licensed market. Wave requests that, as a result of the findings, the OUR implement formal remedies without delay.

Wave also considers that the OUR must include breaches of Licence Condition 26 and 29 into its formal remedies. In the proposed findings of the dispute the OUR states that:

'The DG does not consider it necessary to consider whether or not C&WG has contravened licence conditions 26 and 29 as requested by Wave.'

Wave believes that C&WG did breach the aforementioned Licence Conditions and, as a result, it is critical that the OUR investigates these breaches in order to prevent further breaches in the future.
